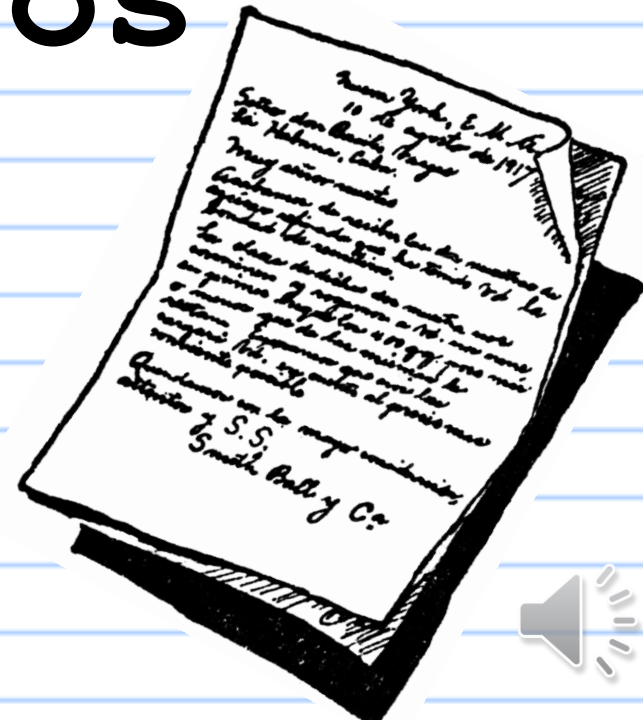


Creating your Digital Portfolio:

The second drawer can include a journal, where you write and reflect on your work,

The third page (or drawer) can include video and or audio clips,

The fourth page may include an interactive calendar shared with your class or teacher, and so on...

the options are endless.

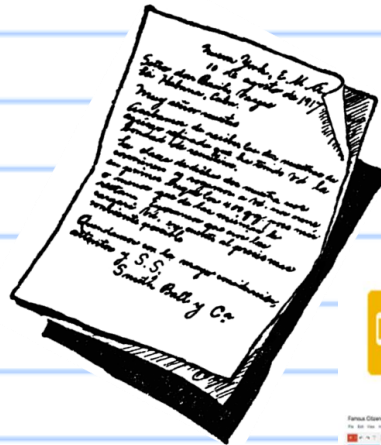
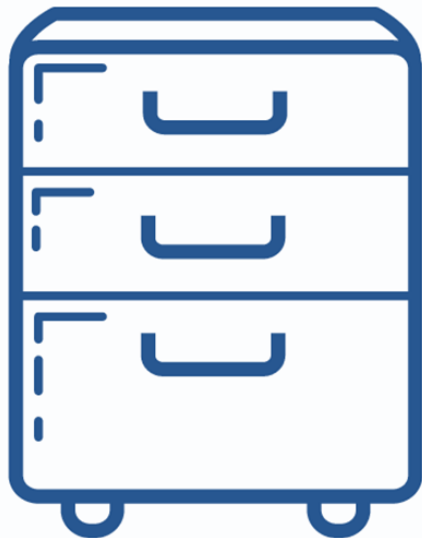
 Web Design (E-Portfolio)

In order to better accommodate these files it is best to organize them in one place, online.



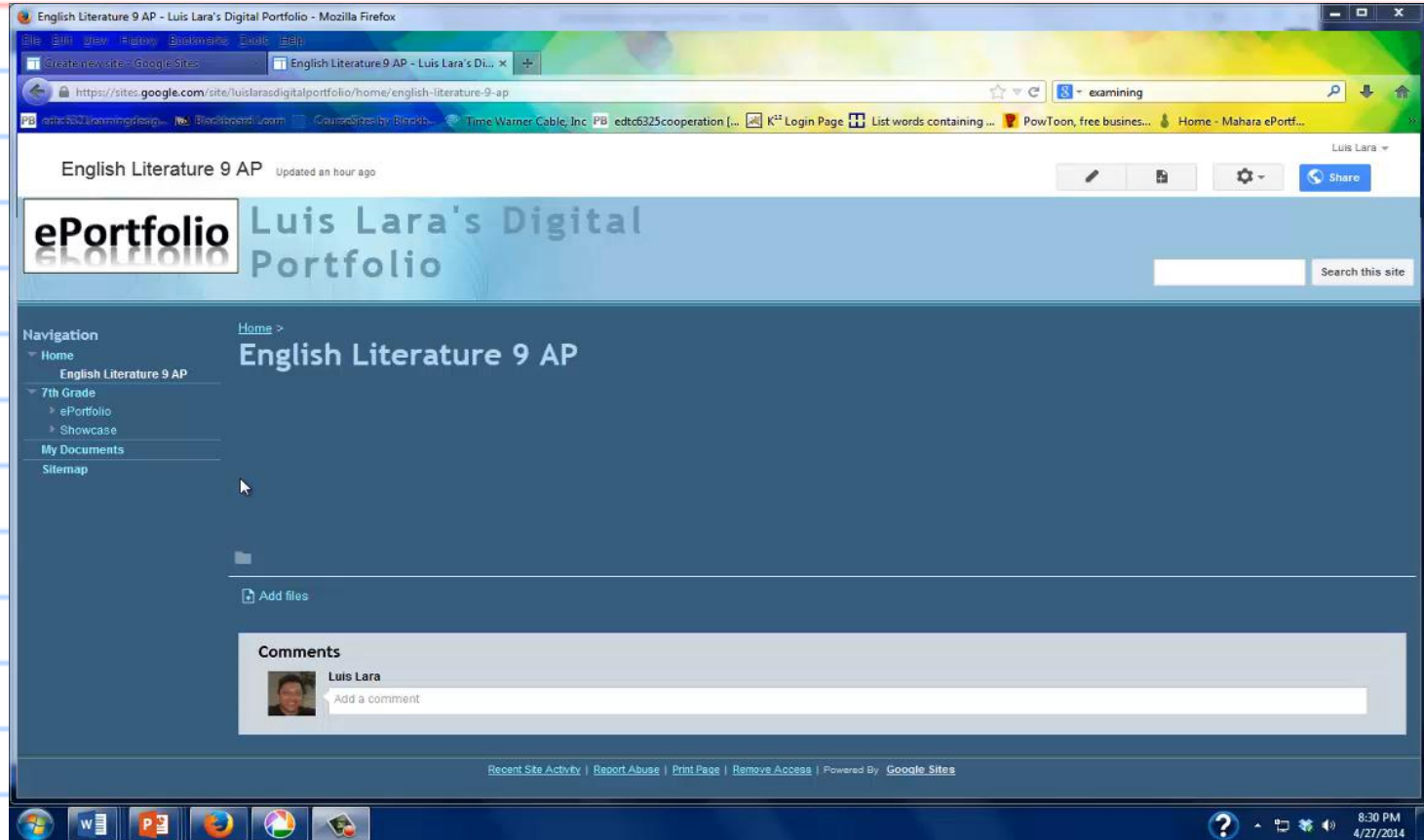
